Applicants must be:

- Currently enrolled on a full-time or parttime basis in a Faculty of Arts graduate coursework program (with at least one semester completed)
- Able to act in a professional manner as a student representative of the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences
- Interested in building lasting connections between students, improving the overall graduate student experience, and providing mentoring and advising to peers
- A team player committed to carrying out roles and responsibilities as agreed, autonomously and/or as part of a group
- Actively invested in fostering the University's core values of respect, diversity, and inclusivity

Other useful skills include:

- Public speaking
- Social media know-how
- Event planning experience
- A thorough knowledge of your degree's structure and course planning requirements

- Assist and advise current or prospective graduate students
