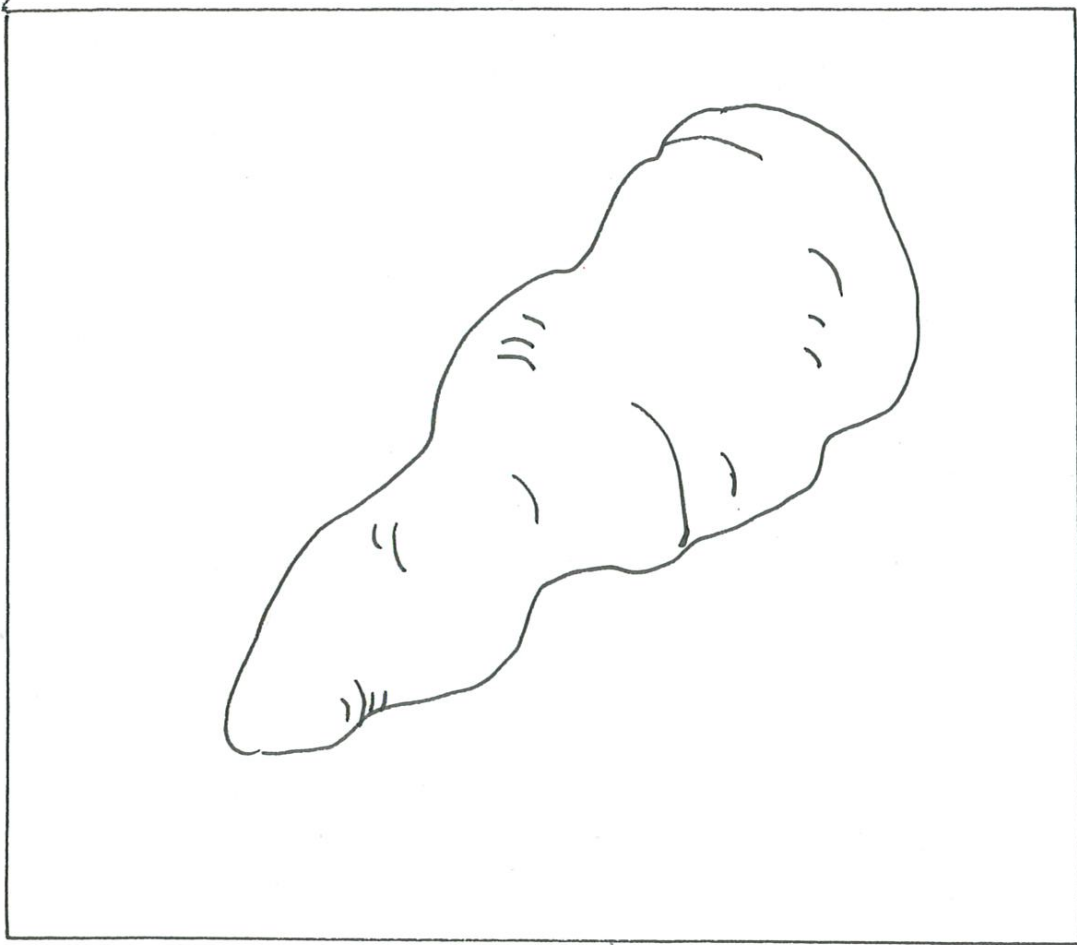

This is a banana.



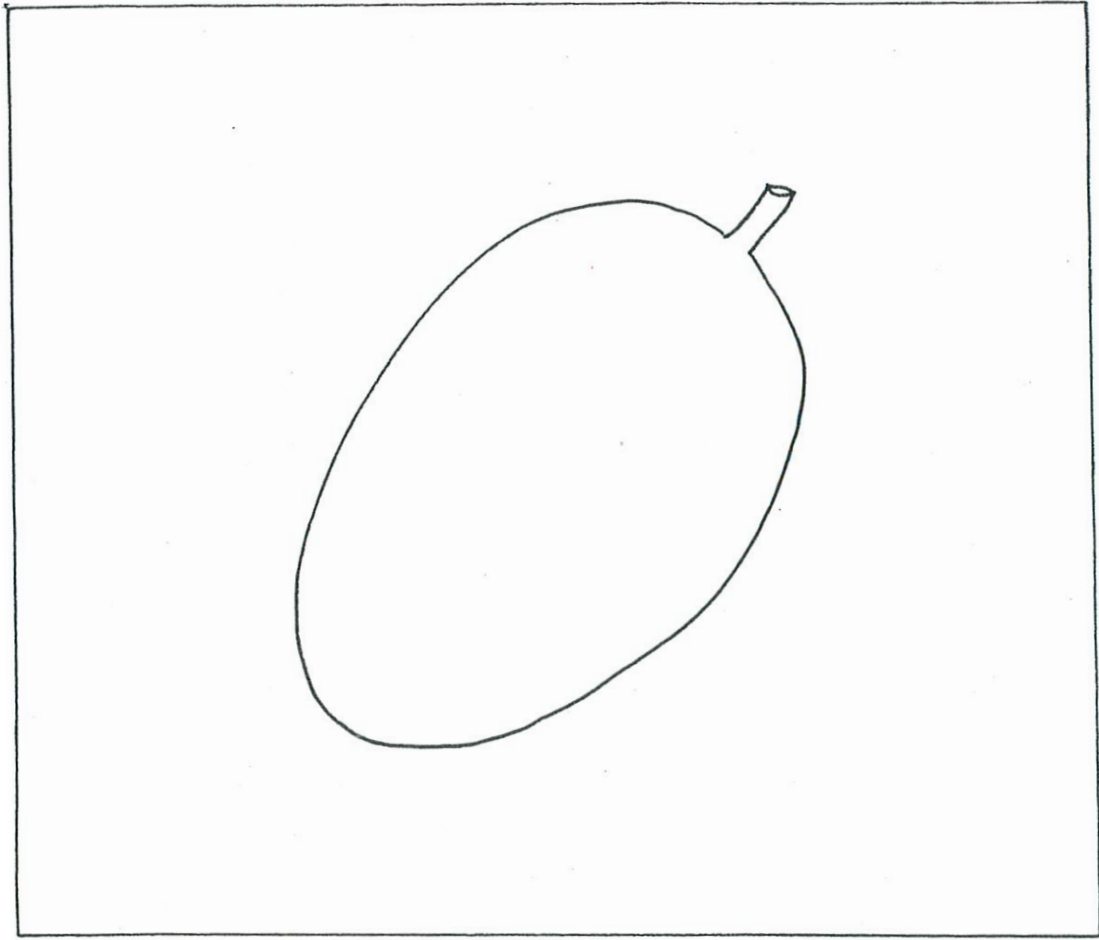

This is a guava.



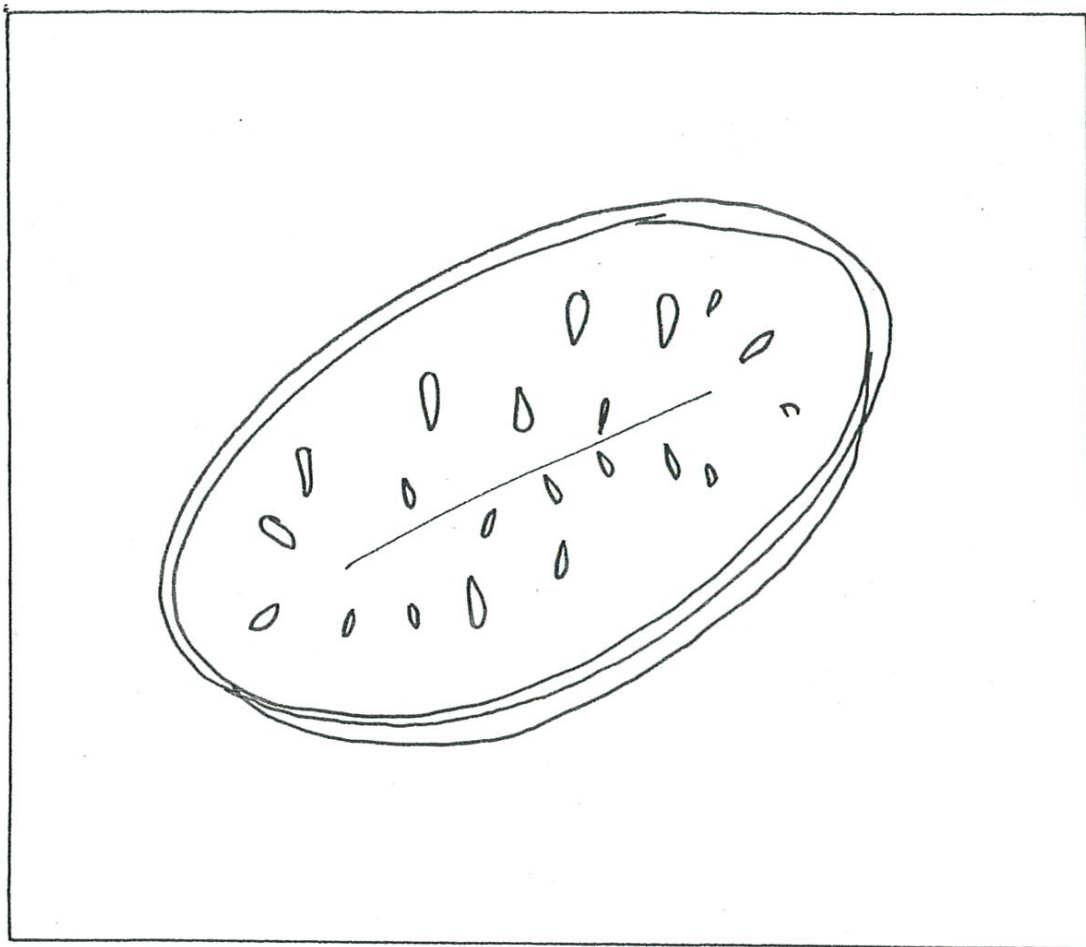
Kan waa bataati macaan.

This is a sweet potato.



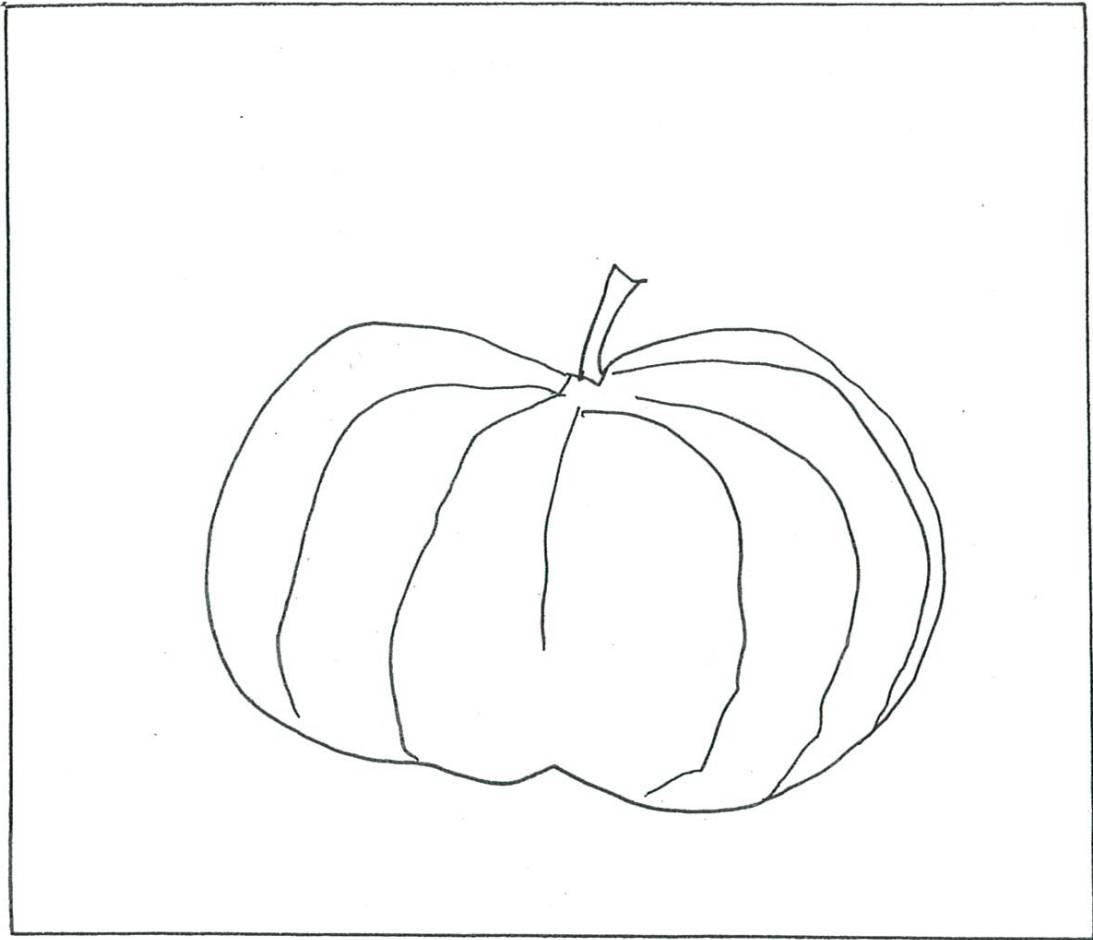
Kan waa cambe.

Kan waa qare.

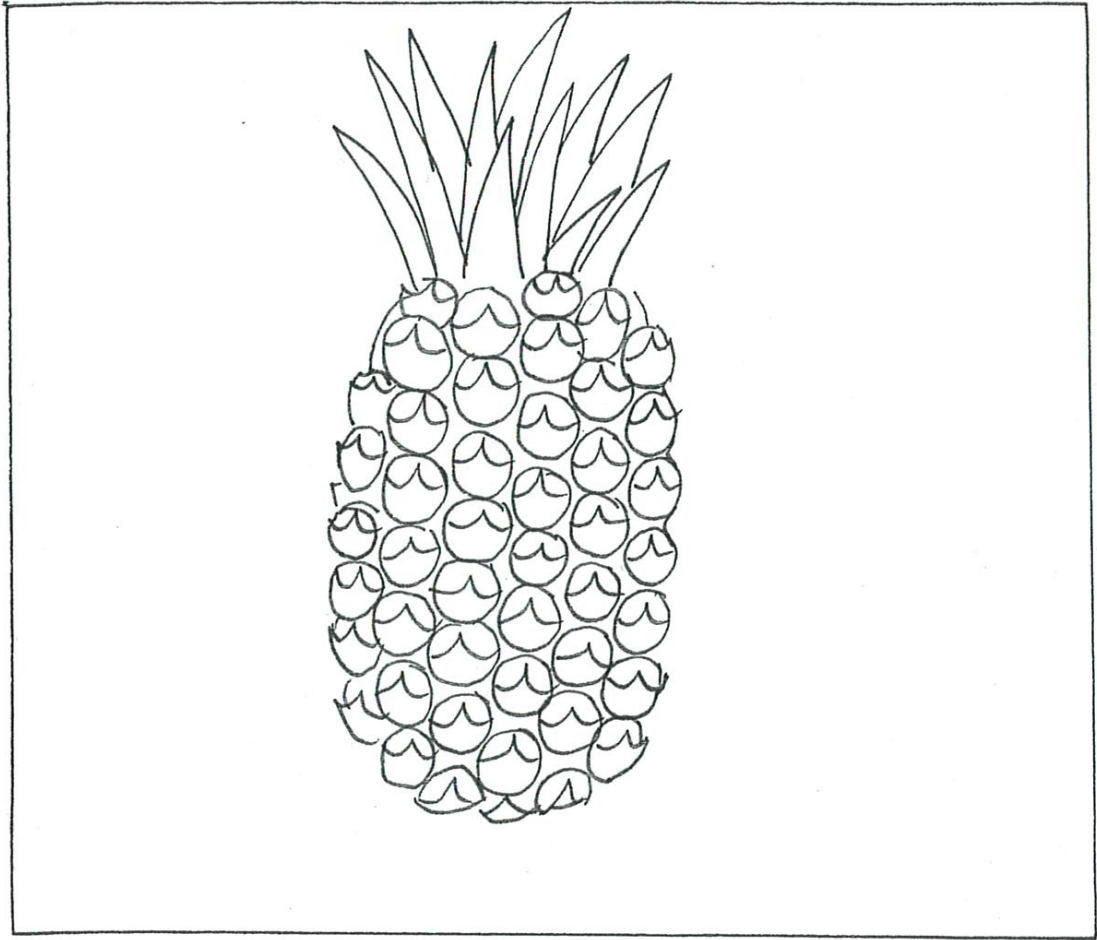
This is a watermelon.



Kan waa bocor.

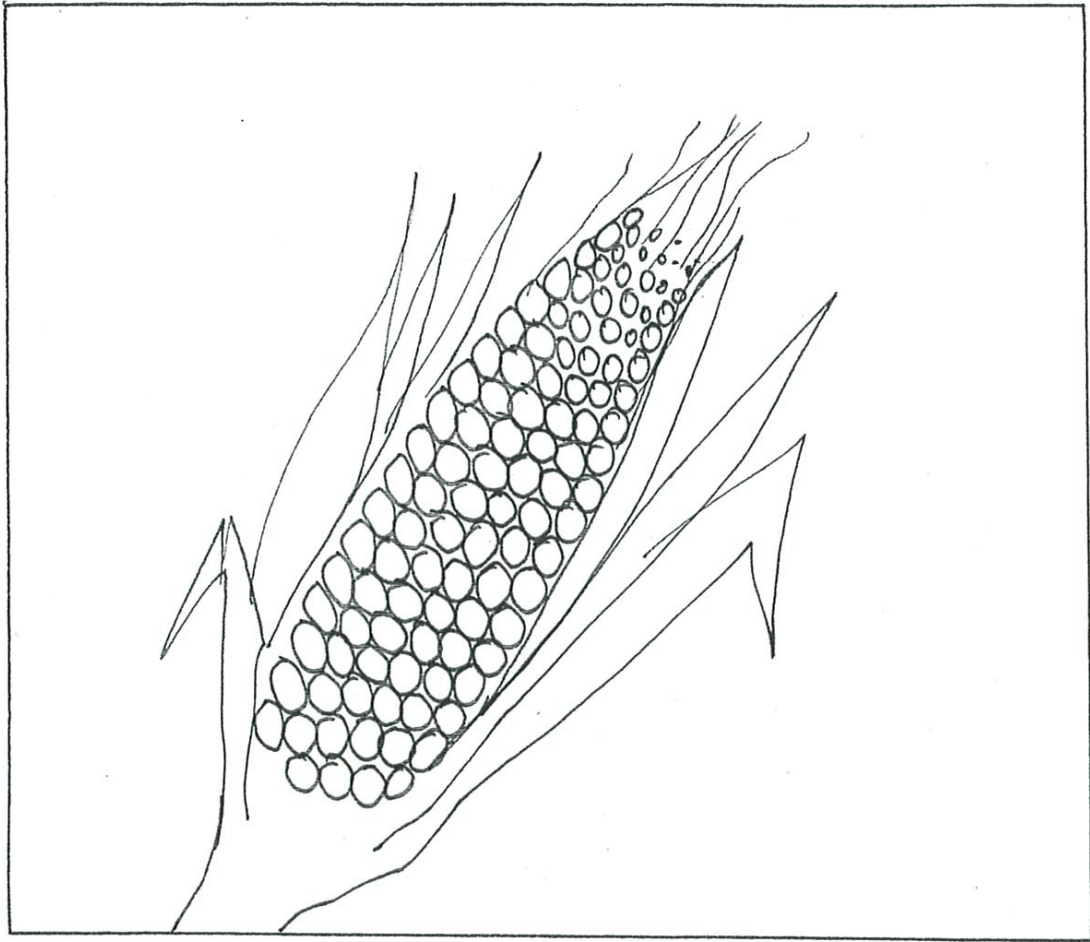
This is a pumpkin.
