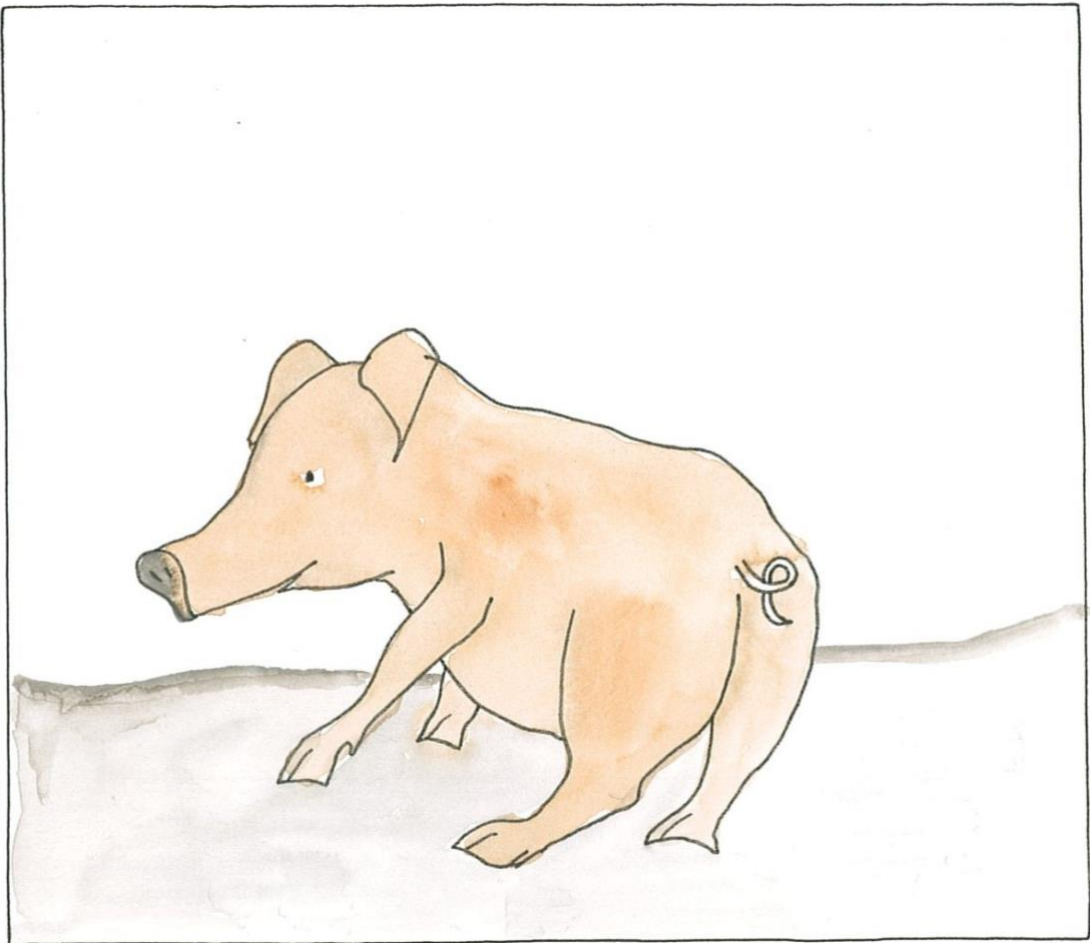

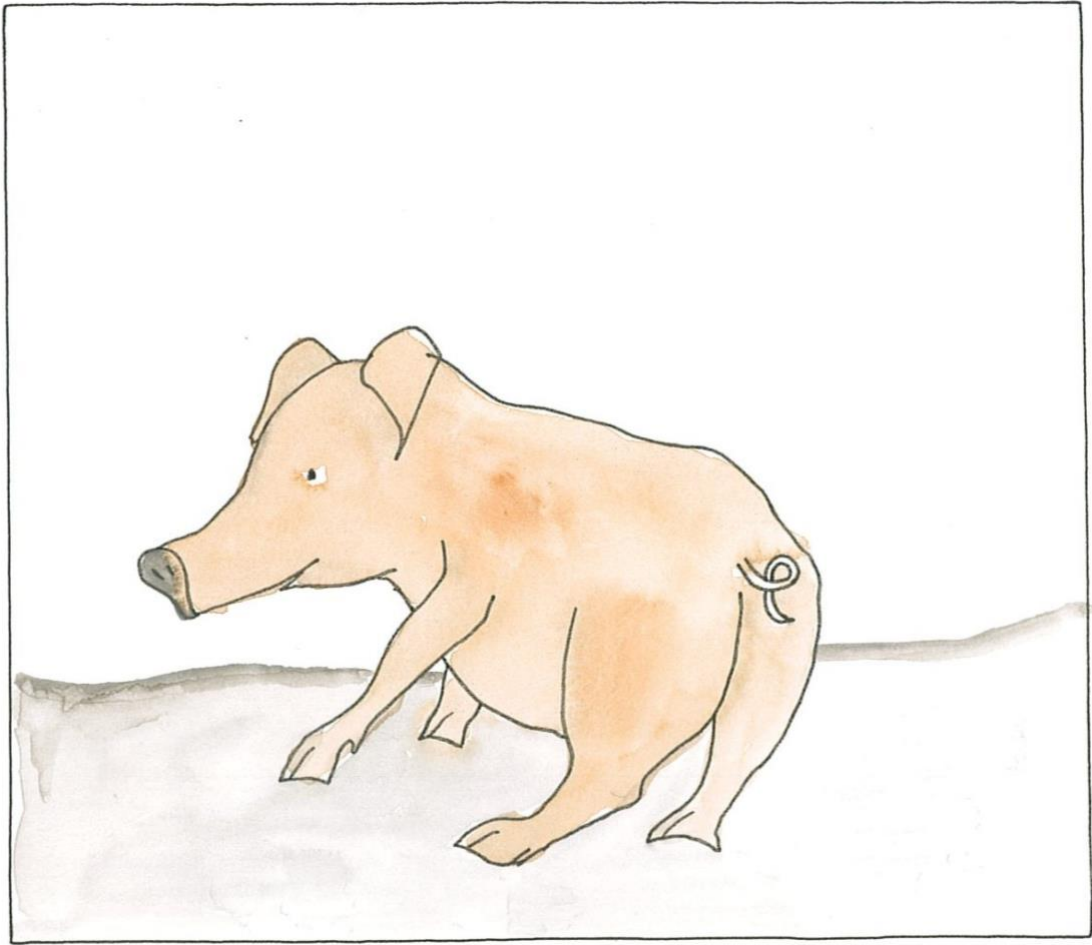

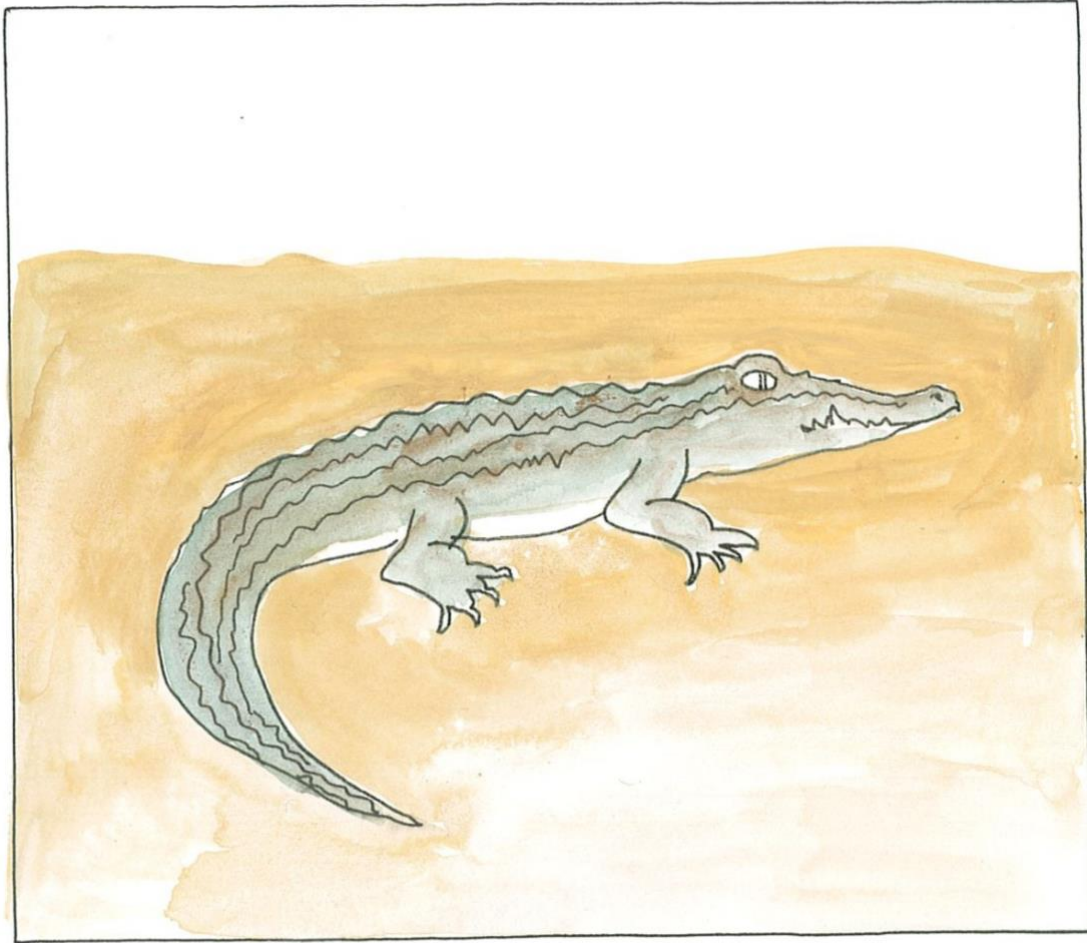

la coda dritta.

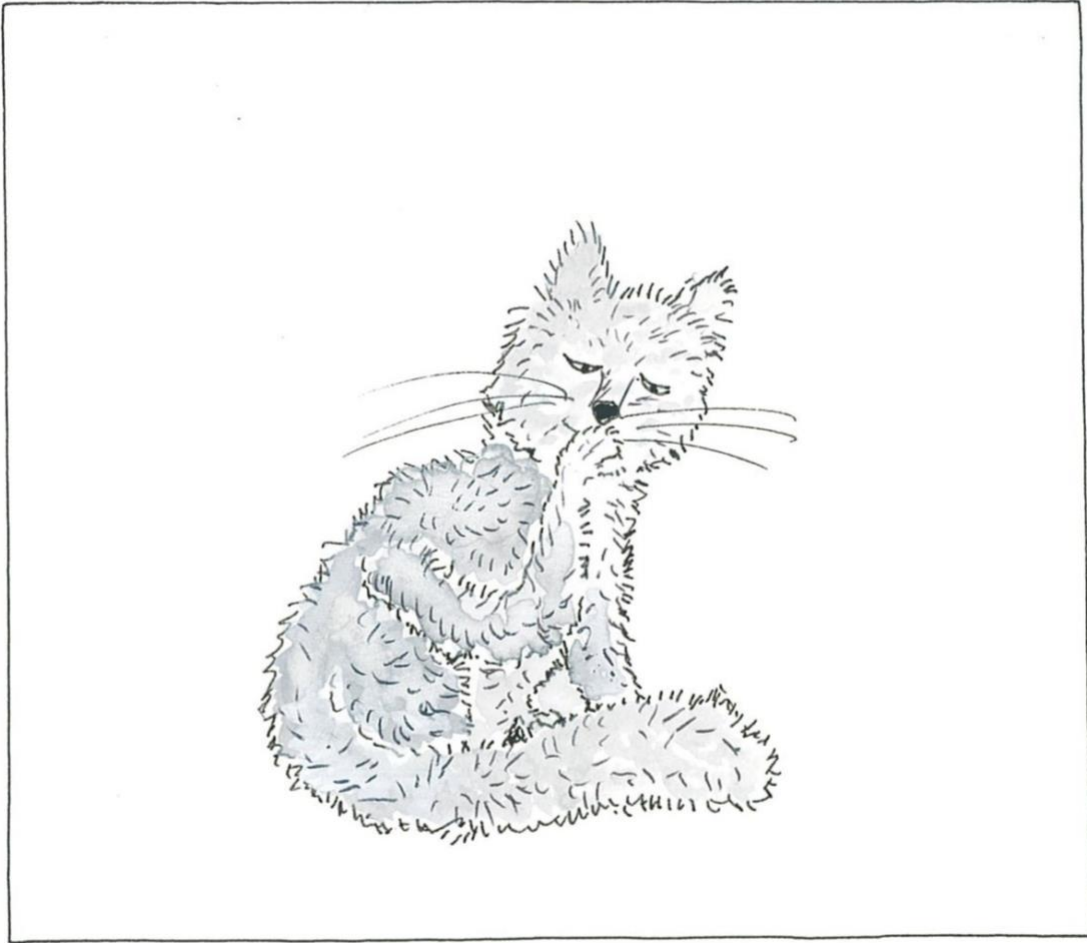
The bird has
