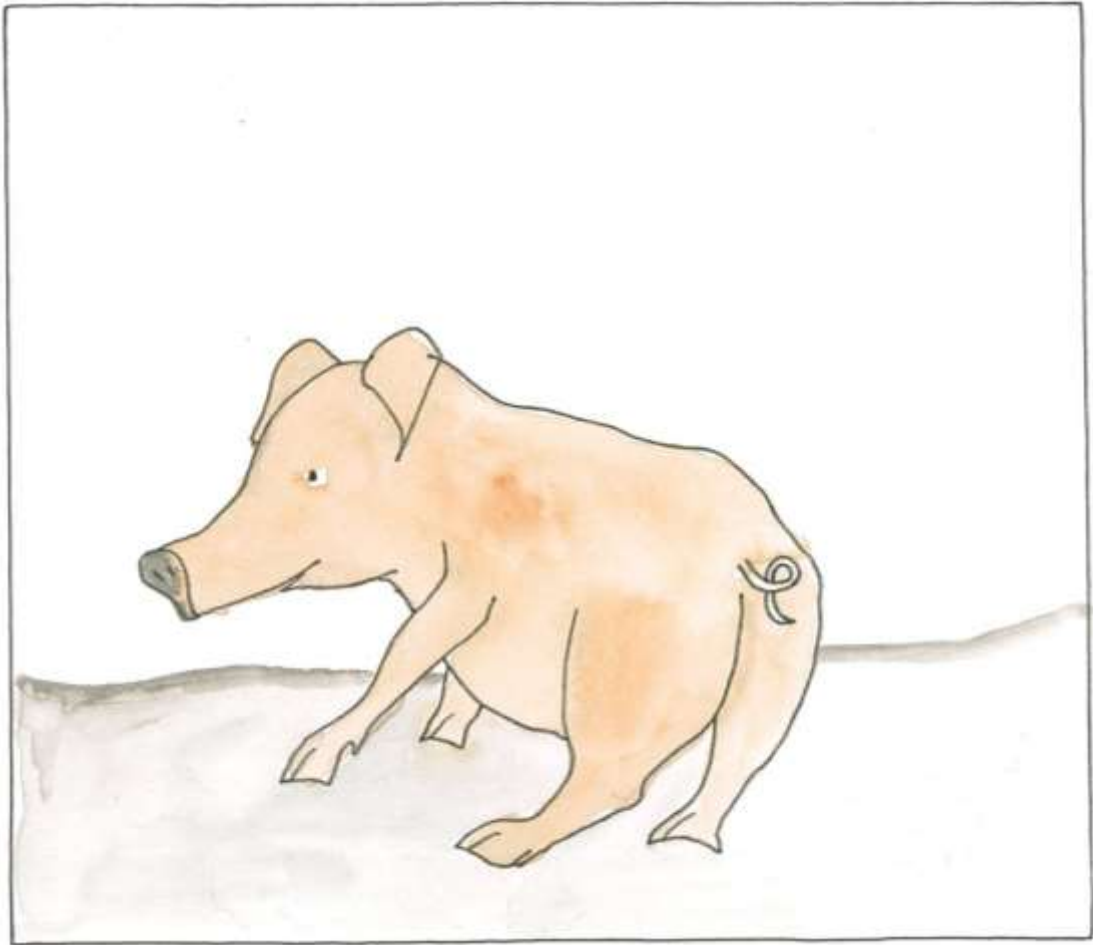

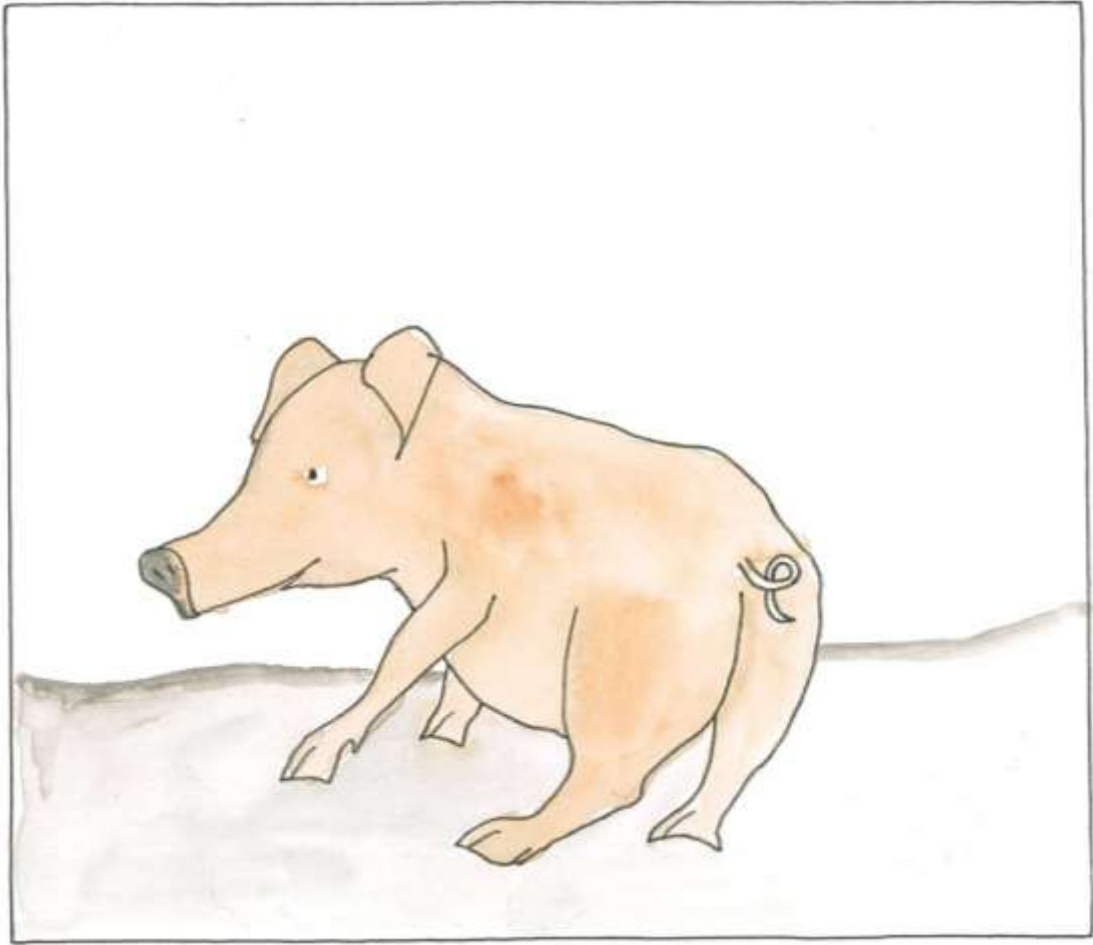

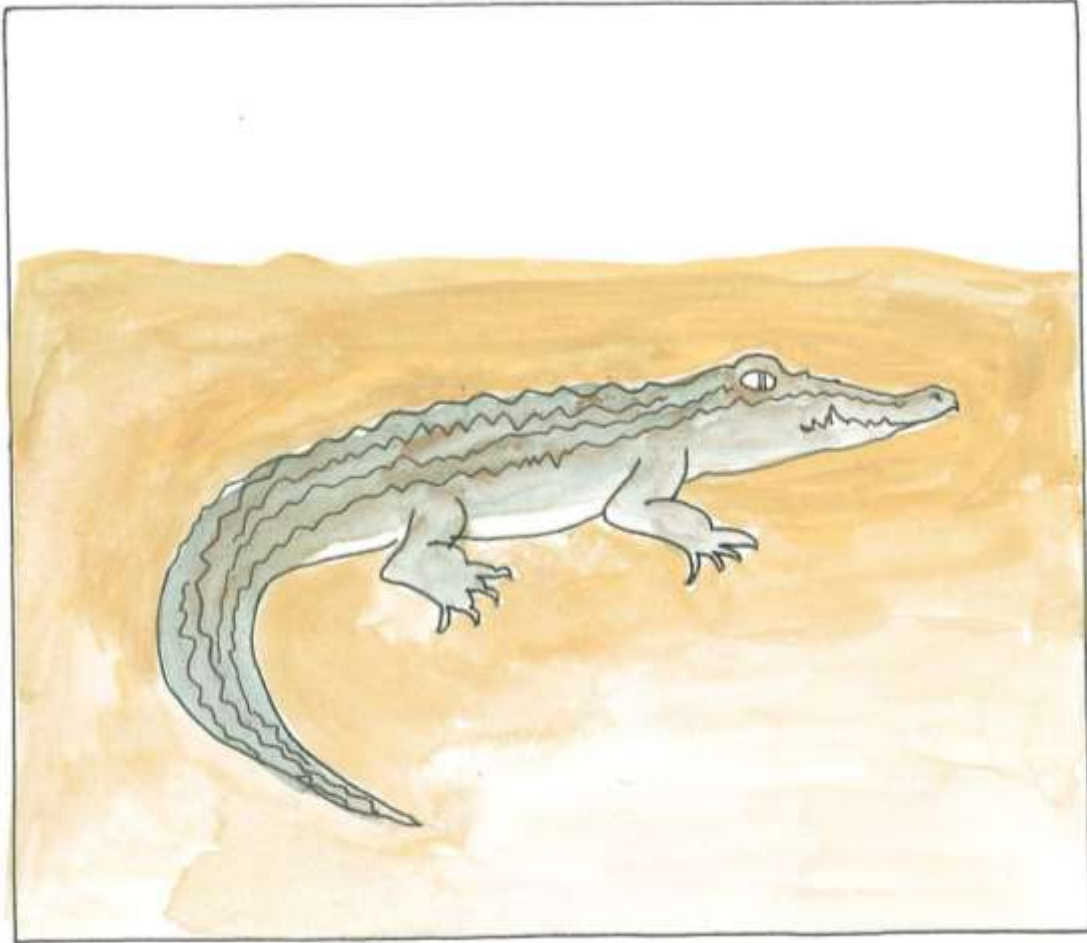

a long tail.



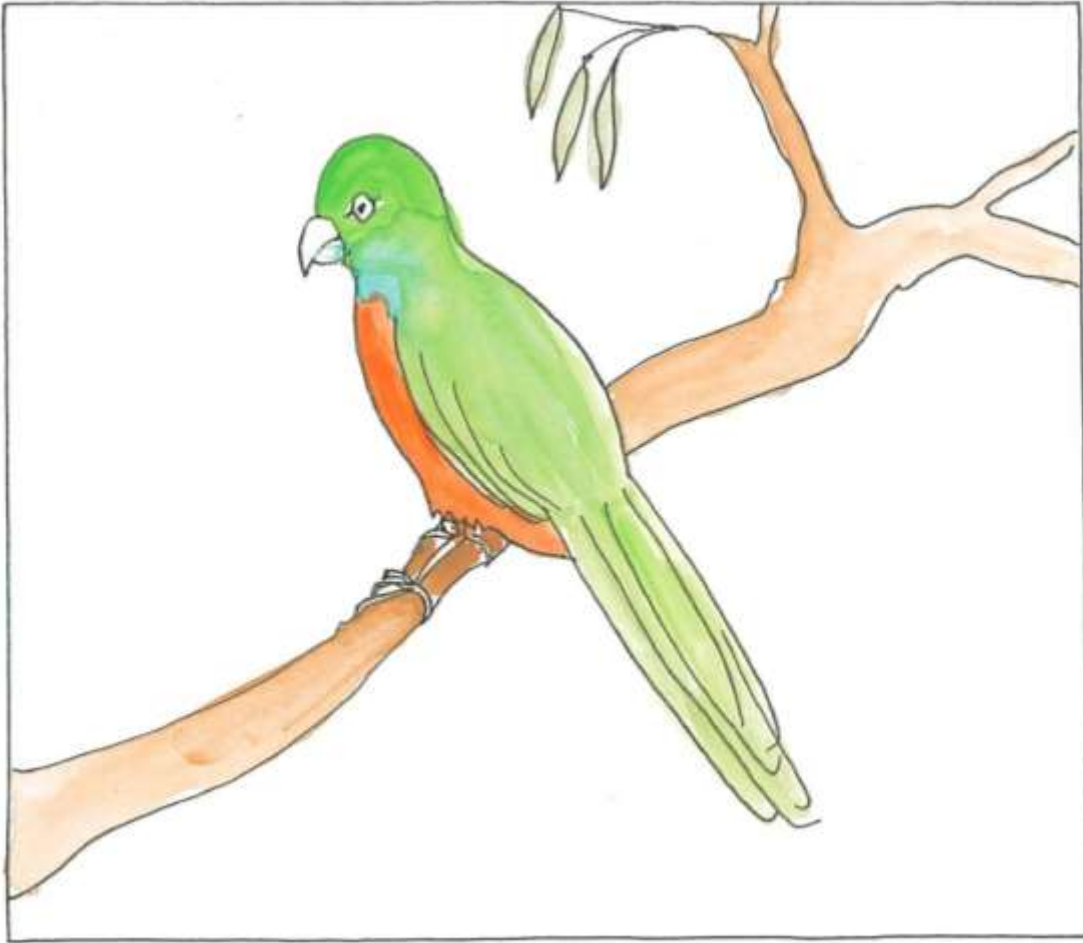
