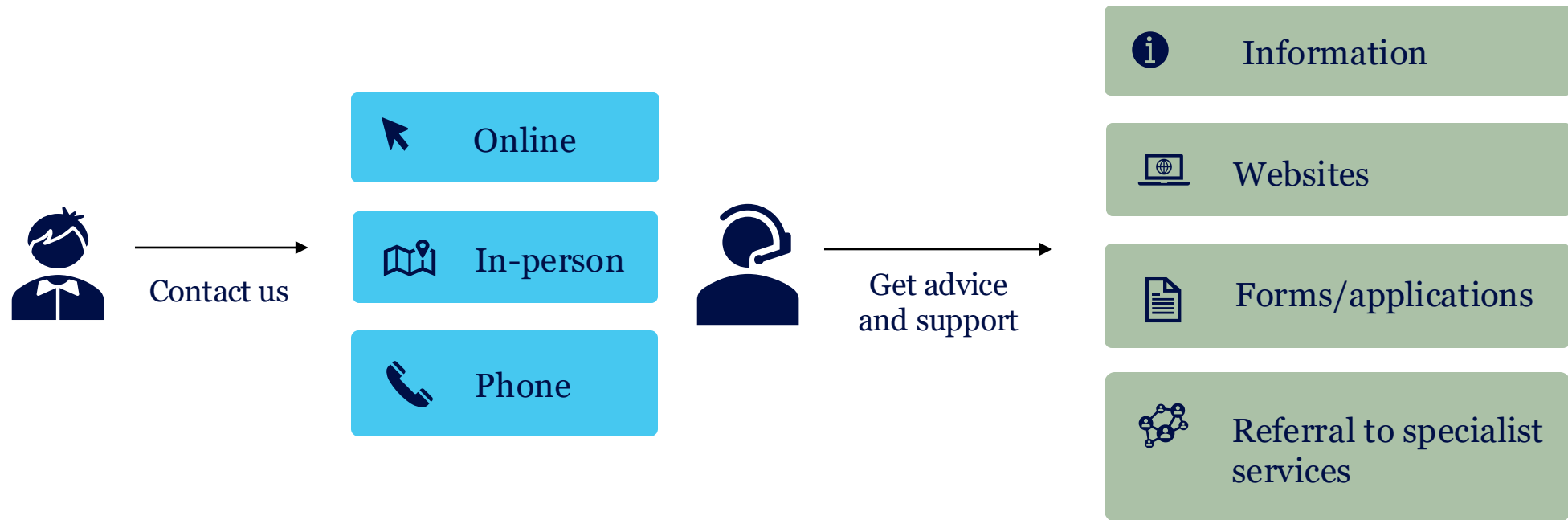

Ways to study Languages

All languages can be started from *beginners*, *intermediate* level or *advanced* level

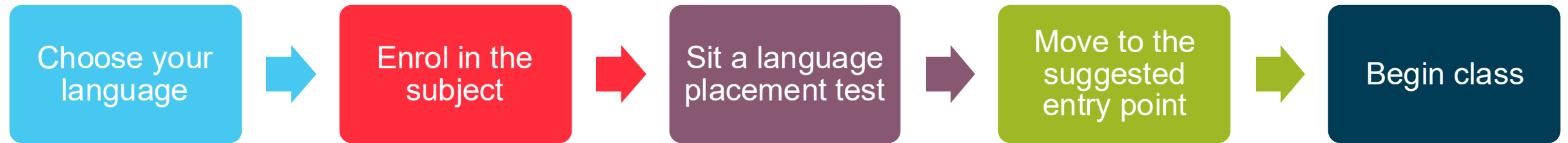
Students in any undergraduate degree can do languages study - your friends in other degrees can study languages with you!

How to enrol



Diploma in Languages

- Usually adds up to one year of study for undergraduate students, but it may be completed in just one extra semester by cross-crediting with electives or breath, overloading, or undertaking Summer or Winter subjects.
- May add up to two years of study for graduate and research students
- Students enrolled as domestic students will have access to CSP in the Diploma in Languages.
- Students with a CSP place may be entitled to a HECS debt exemption for the final 50 points of their diploma (four subjects).

Entry requirements - Diploma in Languages



- Students are permitted to enter the diploma at the start of any semester and before the completion of the companion undergraduate, graduate or research program.
- Undergraduate students are encouraged to complete one year of study before applying for the Diploma in Languages and should complete the appropriate language subjects in the first year of their degree.



How to apply – Diploma in Languages



- Applications open twice each year for start-year (Semester 1) and mid-year (Semester 2) entry.
- It is also possible to commence the diploma in the Summer Semester if required.
- Students should apply for the Diploma prior to the semester in which they wish to commence.
- Students apply for the Diploma in Languages once they have commenced their main degree programs via the Student Portal (my.unimelb)

Application Deadlines Semester one:

- Applications open 10 November
- Close 10 March

Semester two:

- Applications open 11 May
- Close 31 July

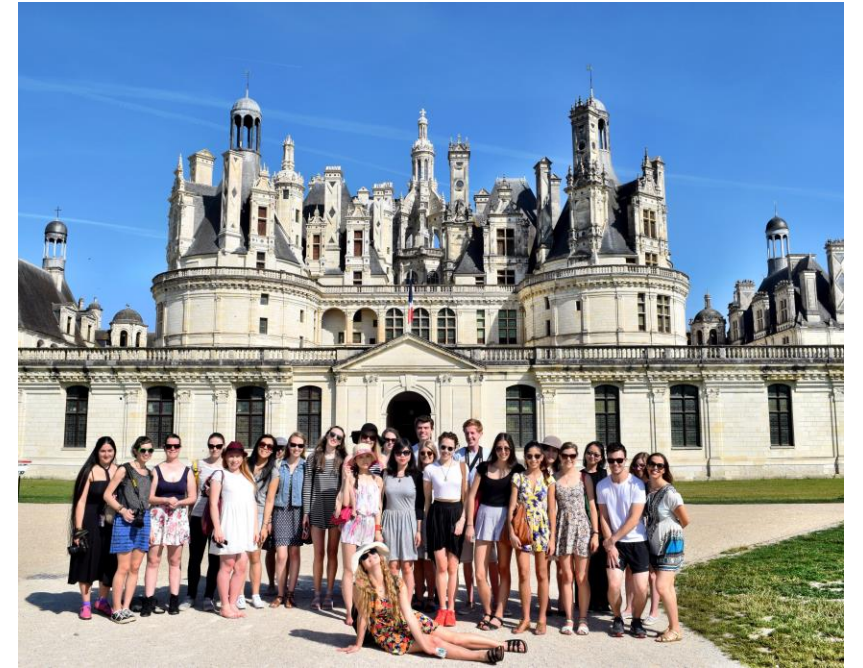

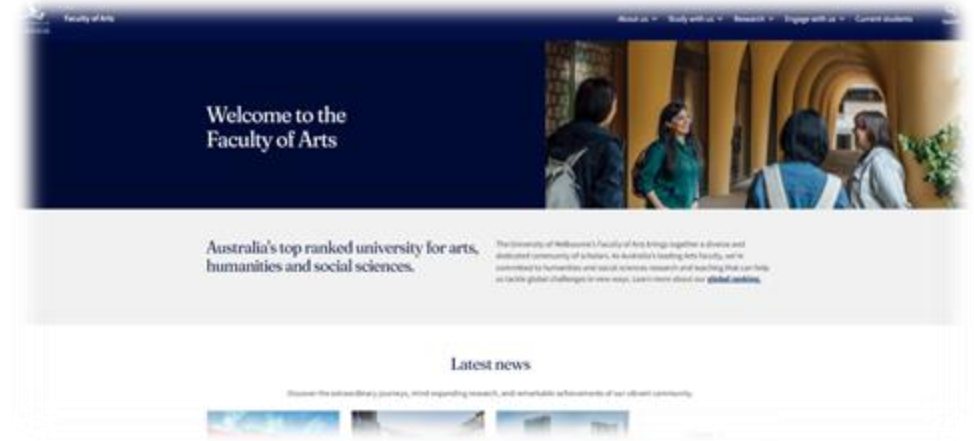

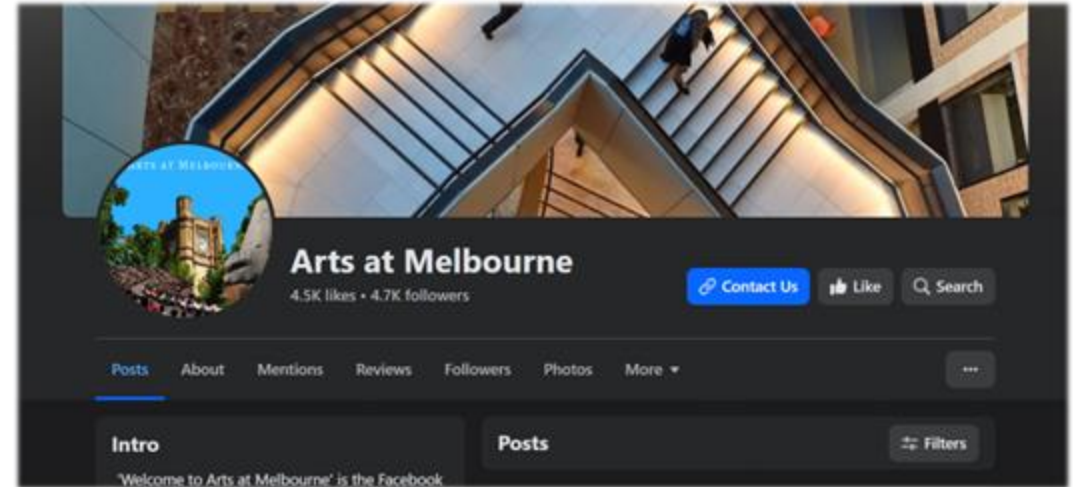

Department of Families, Fairness and Housing



A recent student applied for an internship with DFFH and primarily worked on the Fines Intervention Prevention Project.

During their internship they also had exposure to operational work such as forensic disability and public housing management.



National Gallery of Victoria (NGV)



A student completed an internship in the marketing team with NGV.

They worked across marketing campaigns and developed materials for the Pharaoh, Friday Nights and Africa Fashion exhibitions and events



Sisterworks



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Students consistently find internships with this not-for-profit organisation.

One previous student was involved in a research and outreach project that repurposes discarded materials. Projects at this organisation create employment and training for migrant, refugee and asylum seeker women.

Internship: Personal and Career Growth



This subject supports student entry to the workplace, with students interning across various fields in the government, corporate, cooperatives and mutuals, and for-profit sectors.

The subject involves completion of 80-100 hours of work placement integrating academic learning, employability skills and attributes and an improved knowledge of organisations, workplace culture and career pathways. The placement is supplemented by pre- and post-placement classes.

Students have interned at: Victoria Government, Victoria Police, Museums, Banks, Universities and more!
